July 17, 1962

A meeting of the Eayor and City Council of Ocean City was held in the Eunicipal Euilding on Euesday evening, July 17th, 1962, at 8:00 o'clock.

Mayor Cropper and Councilmen Harman, Jackson, Kelley, FoCabe and Showell were present.

Attorney Marcus J. Villiams and Ingineer Jarrell Legg were also present.

The meeting was called to order by the President of the Council, Harry J. Helley.

The minutes of the meeting of July 10th, 1962, were read and approved.

A proposed budget for this fiscal year had been prepared and copies placed in front of the nembers. This revealed that there would have to be adjustments made in proposed expenditures. It was decided that a meeting will be held on some evening soon other than a Tuesday to go over this proposed budget.

Mr. Juckson stated that Mr. John L. Byrd had talked with him concerning the erection of a no parking sign in front of his ware house on Dorchester Street so that this seculd be used for loading and unloading purposes. This was approved.

Daniel Trimper IV came to this meeting with reference to the construction of water and sewer and streets in the area being developed by Hitchens and Trimper between 9th street and 13th street west of St. Louis Ave. He stated that the dredging operations for this development will be completed in October or Movember. He also stated that several lots have been sold and two of them are sold contingent on the provision of water and severage and the surfacing of streets.

It was brought out that it was proposed that any new developments will be furnished water and sewer to be paid for by the developer. It was further brought out that this area had been approved for devilopment by the Mayor and Council several years ago and at that time nothing was mentioned about the property owners having to furnish these utilities. The clerk was asked to go through the minutes concerning the decision of the Mayor and Council concerning this and other areas and Mr. Tripper was told that the unswer at this time would be based on the minutes of a previous meeting.

Mr. John Howard Eurlage, Nayor of Berlin, came to this meeting concerning the Mayor and Council of Ocean City participating with Perlin in the construction of dog kennels to take care of stray dogs that may be picked up in either of the municipalities. He stated that they have an estimate for the construction of such a facility and have someone near the site to take care of it. It was first decided that the Mayor and members of the council would study a proposed ordinance pertaining to dogs and would decide later on whether or not to participate with Derlin. Mr. Showell suggested that they decide in favor of it at this meeting so that we can begin to use the facility at once. Further consideration decided against this and Mr. Furbage was advised that a decision will be made later on.

Mr. Calvin Pruitt came to this meeting at the request of Mr. Williams concerning the proposed convention hall. It was stated that Windsor Resort has set a price on 150 ft. of land at "110,000.00 and that the company interested in the proposed convention hall would purchase the land from the City that they (the City) deem unnecessary for a right of way. A price of "65,000.00 for a 50 ft. right-of-way was also quoted by Windsor Resort.

Mr. Williams suggested that each of the real estate dealers in (cean City be asked to appraise the land in question and come up with a price so that the Mayor and Council will have something to go on in making their decision.

Mr. Jakksph stated that Mr. Stanton Milson had asked him to request of the Mayor and Council that he be allowed to construct a trailer park on his land at 41st street. Mr. Cropper told him that Mr. Wilson had been in the office on this date pertaining to this and the clerk was to look up the zoning on this.

Lr. Showell stated that he had noticed some sort of obstruction on  $\mathcal{E}t$ . Louis Aveneur 14th street and asked that it be corrected.

A tape recording of an editorial over TTT was played. This was with reference to purchasing, and other items pertaining to the operation of the Coean City government.

The meeting adjourned on motion at 9:30 o'clock.
